This hymn is often sung at Synod events and gatherings. I thought of it as I was putting together my thought for this Beacon. I believe God is calling two, or more likely three, of us to a very special ministry among the Body of Christ at Trinity Lutheran. The shape of ministry has changed, and no longer is it possible for the one ordained pastor to “do” all the ministry of the congregation, and do the things that he or she must do day to day, and respond to emergencies, etc. The future of most growing ministries is that it they are a partnership between ordained and lay ministers. I believe this is to be Trinity’s model.

God is calling from within the congregation of Trinity Lutheran two, or possibly three, Lay Ministers of Visitation. These Visitation Ministers would make home visits to shut ins and elderly, to those having difficulty getting to church for any reason, to Nursing Homes and Rehab Centers, offering Communion when appropriate. Training will be given!!! With two or three Ministers of Visitation, each would be making an average of 1 to 2 visits per week at this time.

This would be a ministry on behalf of the congregation of Trinity Lutheran Church. As such, Council would endorse the names of the Visitation Ministers for training. When training is completed, I would present the new Ministers of Visitation to the congregation for Commissioning to their new position.

Be in prayer about this... it is a “behind the scenes” type of ministry without a lot of recognition or glory, but the rewards are great. Every visit brings something different, and bringing the sacrament to a shut-in is awesome. See if God is calling YOU. *Listen...*





Calling all Thespians... Trinity is forming a Drama Troupe! If you were involved in drama in school, or just like watching plays, etc., or you have ever been told you are a big "ham," then you are just what we need. We have the scripts, the director, the beginning of a cast, now we need you! Some scripts call for two or three actors, others call for five or more. This would be an "occasional" ministry... when a script fit the day's theme and the actors we have, etc. This can be a lot of fun and a unique, POWERFUL way to communicate the Gospel. Advent Special Offering  
Samaritan Discretionary Fund

The Samaritan Discretionary Fund is a great ministry of Trinity Lutheran Church. I know of other churches that do not have anything like it, and so are unable to fulfill Jesus' mandate to give to the poor and those who need help. But one weakness of our Fund is that we have never made provision for it to be "restocked." There is no regular inflow of money to the fund, only outgo. I have heard some say "Well, the people you give money to are supposed to pay it back." To which I say, many of them promise me they will, but I will see it when donkeys fly. Quit worrying about that, it isn't going to happen on any regular basis (it hasn't happened yet in my almost 3 and ½ years here). So the problem remains, how to replenish this fund in order to help those who fall between the cracks?

This Advent season, there will be an offering basket in the back of the church for the Samaritan Discretionary Fund. If you wish to contribute to this fund, please place your offering in this basket during the Advent Season. To receive credit for your offering, either place it in an envelope with your name on it, or use a check so that it may be credited to your account.

The people that benefit from this fund are varied. In Advent, I will very briefly tell four of their stories, without revealing any confidential information (which may make for some really brief stories!)

## **“A VIEW FROM THE PEW”**

### **“Smile and pass it on”**

“Are you any relation to the Polkowski’s from Zion in Clarence Center?” he asked. “Yes. They are my mother, father and grandmother.” I responded. “I’m Ed Ingalsbe. I went to Zion for a while.” He proceeded to tell me about how he started at Trinity, moved away and returned to the area. It was from then that, every week we were both in church, I would look and greet him, or he would find and greet me. It starts quite simply.

**“So in everything, do to others what you would have them do to you...” – Mathew 7:12**

I was saddened, when earlier this year I saw Ed in the park at a Village event and he explained what his situation was. He was deciding to move to Batavia to be closer to family. So he explained that we would not see him in church much longer. So, I was happy that Pastor took the time to acknowledge him and his decision. He always offered up support and ideas when we spoke. He was a friendly face, warm heart and good strong handshake. One week, he went back to Zion. I received a call from my parents that afternoon. “Ed was in church today. He was telling us about meeting you. He was telling us about everything going on there at Trinity”.

**“If you then... know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him.” – Luke 11:13**

And what starts with just a handshake and a friendly hello, changes into something more. It is by our own actions that we show what is important to us and who we are. I think that we are always looking for that big ‘Halleluiah’ moment, when, all we need to look for is the simple moments. When you think about doing unto others, you think big. It comes up only when the wrong is a big wrong and the forgiveness equal in size. But it is in the little things too often, that it is overlooked. And it is not just about forgiveness, but of hospitality, respect, friendliness, hope, peace and love.

The gifts we give are not always in the physical, but often in the spiritual and emotional.

**“One man gives freely, yet gains even more; another withholds unduly, but comes to poverty.”  
– Proverbs 11:24**

At this time of year, remember that it was a baby in a simple manger. It was making due with what we have, not what we don’t. It was giving and receiving. It was about sharing the gifts we were given and the good news. Share with those around you. Let them know that you care. And when receiving, make sure that the giver knows that their efforts and goodwill are not in vain, but are truly well received.

It can be a handshake. It can be a message of support. It can be as simple as a smile. But God’s hope and spirit is in each one of us to give. It does not have to be a large effort, but a simple one. Ed, thanks for the support. Thanks for the smiles. Your actions made a difference.

And when once given, pass it on. I was approached in the parking lot after service on a Sunday. “I do miss those articles in the Beacon you wrote. They always lightened my spirits.” Thanks for reminding me to give what I have been given. This one’s for you.

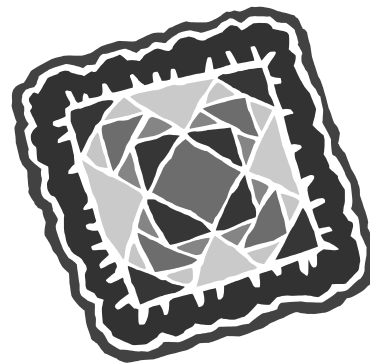

## PRAYER SHAWL GROUP

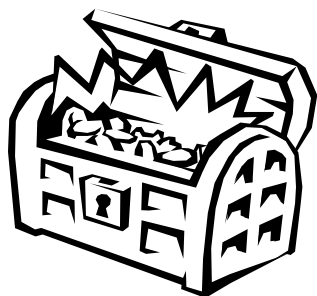

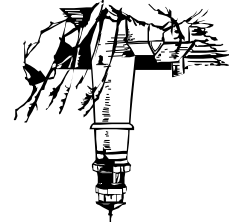
